## Martin Ouředníček

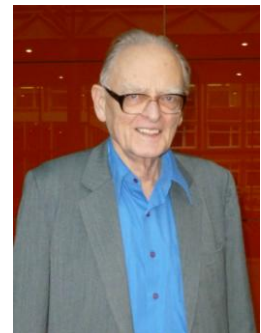

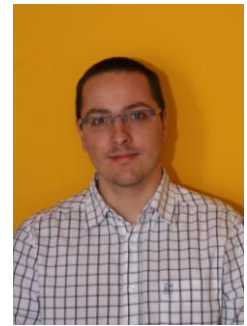
