The Course Objective:

To provide the Charles University geography students with an opportunity to learn about Canada's geography from a Canadian geographer's and a Canadian resident's perspective. The language of instruction will be English.

Course Content:

This rather compact intensive course will consist of a series of seven lectures and at Charles University in Prague during late May and early June 2011.

The course will include:

- A brief overview of the physical patterns of Canada with reference to the significance for human occupance and land use
- The focus of the course will be on specific regions of Canada:
 - The Maritime provinces
 - Ouebec
 - Ontario
 - The Prairie provinces
 - British Columbia
 - The northern territories

For each region the themes will include:

- The emergence of the socio-economic and urban patterns from the earliest times
- The present socio-economic and urban character
- Selected issues and problems of importance and relevance
